Katherine is certified in the Wilson Reading Program, EmPOWER Writing program, and endorsed in Project Read.

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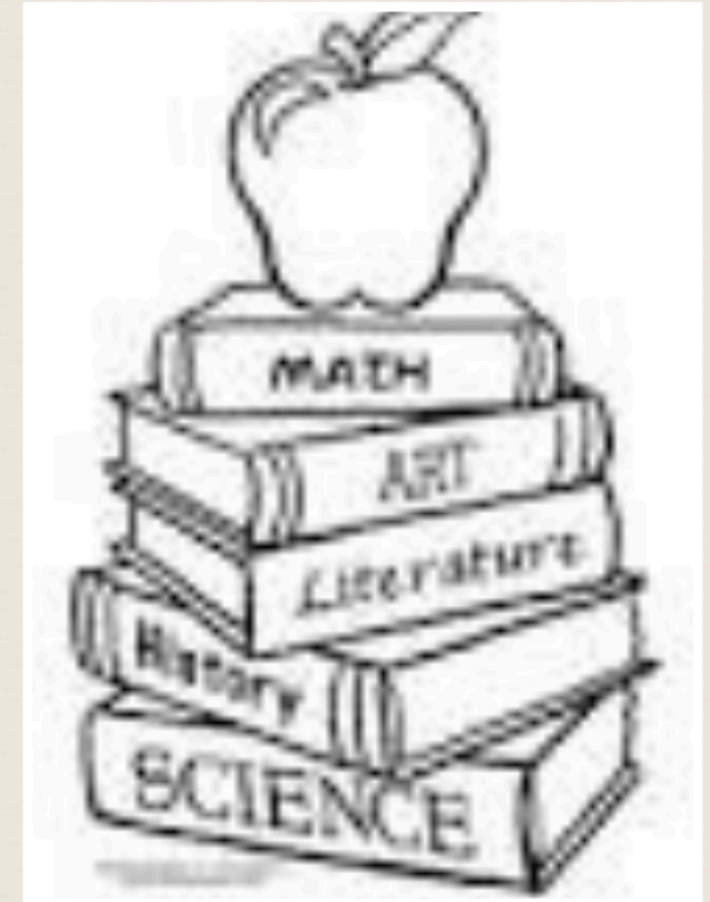
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READING COMPREHENSIO
