# Social Studies - Jonathan French

## “Other People Matter”



### Freshman World History (CP, ACC and Honors )

- This course provides a foundation for the study of World and American history, literature, and the fine arts. Selected topics from both Western and non-Western cultures are studied from an economic, political and social aspect.
- Students interested in the Honors course should meet the criteria outlined on page 8 of the Program of Studies.
- Students in the accelerated level are expected to do independent reading, handle research topics, and write at an advanced level.

### Freshman World Humanities (CP/ACC)

### Freshman English: Themes of Humanity in Literature (CP/ACC)

- This is a full-year class and is scheduled for a double period.
- World Humanities is a thematically taught course that focuses on major events in World History through the lens of literature, non-fiction texts, art, and music

**Note: *Students must take both Humanities English and Humanities History - and will receive credit in each.***

### Civics on Demand (CoD)

1. Demonstrate civic knowledge, skills, and dispositions.

### Connection Investigations (Connectignations)

2. Identify and Compare Historical Periods, Patterns, and Themes (Synthesis) Through the Development of Focused Questions or Problem Statements and By Conducting Inquiries. Furthermore, Understanding Context is Essential to this Practice.

### Don't Get Catfished

3. Evaluate the credibility, accuracy, and relevance of each source.

### Critical Source Investigation (CSI)

4. Organize information and data from multiple primary and secondary sources.

### Deep Dive

5. Analyze the purpose and point of view of each source; distinguish opinion from fact.

### Back It Up!

6. Argue or explain conclusions using valid reasoning and evidence.

### Pay It Forward

7. Determine next steps and take informed action, as appropriate.

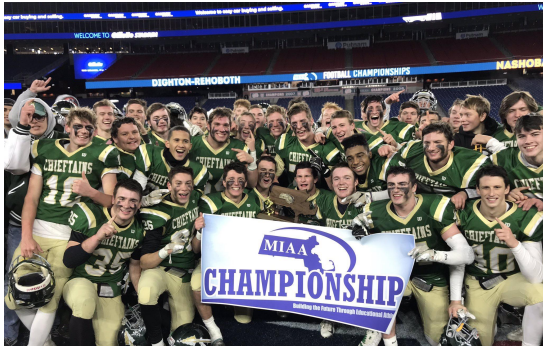

  - Week of 3/6 - Administration & Guidance present to the students at each of the three middle schools
  - 3/16 - Course recommendations by teachers are due
  - 3/20 - High school counselors visit each middle school and begin course sign ups with 8th graders
  - 3/29 - Course sign up deadline

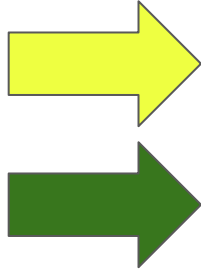
